#### **Student/Parent/Teacher Conferences**

Compass is both web-based and available as an app. Through Compass you can enter explanations for absences and view your child's progress as comments are posted fortnightly. A comment on Learning Behaviours will be posted soon.

#### Don't forget your hat!



We are a Sun Smart school, therefore all students and staff are to wear a hat when outside. The hot days and bushfires are a stark reminder of how important it is to protect our skin from sunburn. Students need a plain navy blue, broad brimmed hat in Term 1 and Term 4. These can be bought from the school for \$8.00 each, or any shop in town. If students do not have a hat, they will be asked to play on the big deck or the rotunda .

#### Helping to Make a Difference

#### • Breakfast Program

Are you available one morning a week to serve breakfast to our students? This takes less than an hour of your time. The necessity of breakfast to growing minds is very important and gives them the best start to the day. Please let us know if you are able to help.

At the moment we NO volunteers to serve breakfast to the students.

#### Lunches

Can you help to organise (not cook) lunches for the term? This would involve coordinating with the café and parents. Also completing a Food Handling course, which is a requirement from the Shire.

#### **Our Water**

Students at school can refill their drink bottles in the staffroom if they want to during the day. The water in the staffroom is filtered and it also chilled! Great for those hot days.

Last Friday we had a Hot Day Timetable, and the students stayed inside to keep cool. Whenever the temperature is rising to 40.C—we will stay inside, for the health and wellbeing of students and staff.

And in typical Victorian weather, we almost had a Wet Day Timetable just 72 hours later!


#### **School Photos**

School Photos will be taken on Tuesday 18th February. Order envelopes will be distributed as soon as they are received.

Full school uniform is required.

Please complete the envelope, enclose your payment and send in to school. We need to have all envelopes back by photo day. If you have not returned your envelope, your child will still have their photo taken but you will have to arrange with the photographer directly to make payment and receive photos.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> do not make any direct deposit payments to the school for photos. Payments are made to the photographer only - cash or credit card slip payment.



#### Medication

Following our Administration of Medication policy, which is guided by the Education Department, staff are not allowed to give students any medication unless there is a letter from the doctor. Having medication with the prescription attached, is also included in this. We also cannot give cough medication, hayfever tablets, eye drops, panadol etc, unless there is a letter from the doctor.

Therefore, when your child receives their prescription, please also ask the doctor to write a letter for the school.

This also includes when the school has camps and excursions – you can no longer give the teacher in charge the medication, unless there is a letter from the doctor.

#### **School Council**

School Council is a great way to be involved at the school. Nominations will be open from Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> of February and close the 19<sup>th</sup> February at 4pm. Nomination forms are available from the office during this time. Please consider joining School Council to assist in the efficient governance and enhance the educational opportunities of our students.

School Council meets twice a term on the second Tuesday of the month at 6.00pm.

#### Working with Children Check

All parents and friends who wish to volunteer at our school need to have a



Working With Children Check (WWCC). This is an Education Department requirement, and part of our schools Child Safe Policy passed by School Council.

To apply for the card go the WWCC website: <a href="https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/">https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/</a> complete the form, print it out and take to the nearest large post office (not Tarwin Lower) with suitable ID. A photo will be taken at the Post Office. There is no charge for volunteers.

All volunteers also need to be inducted every year, so please arrive earlier on the first day so we can go through OHS and Child Safe policies.

Would you like to volunteer to help the school with fundraising this year? The wonderful Vanessa Fisher desperately needs some other parents to help her with fundraising events.



Our revamped enrolment forms now contain a permission form that covers for the whole of the time that the student attends Tarwin Lower Primary School.

If you have a problem with this or you wish to revoke permission you are able to do this at any time.

#### **Other Excursions/Events**

If you have Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (CSEF) money, you will have the option to choose 'USE CSEF' as your payment.

If you want to pay cash, you will need to download the permission form and send it in to school with the cash.

I know they will do an outstanding job.


#### Welcome!


These core values are the cornerstone on which we build our vision and underpin all that we do.

#### School procedures for the bushfire season

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter, SMS and email. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- . No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.
- The school bus will not operating

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the CFA advise that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.


As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan.


#### What can parents do?

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone number and email address.
   Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters and reading the website.
- Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal
  area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.


